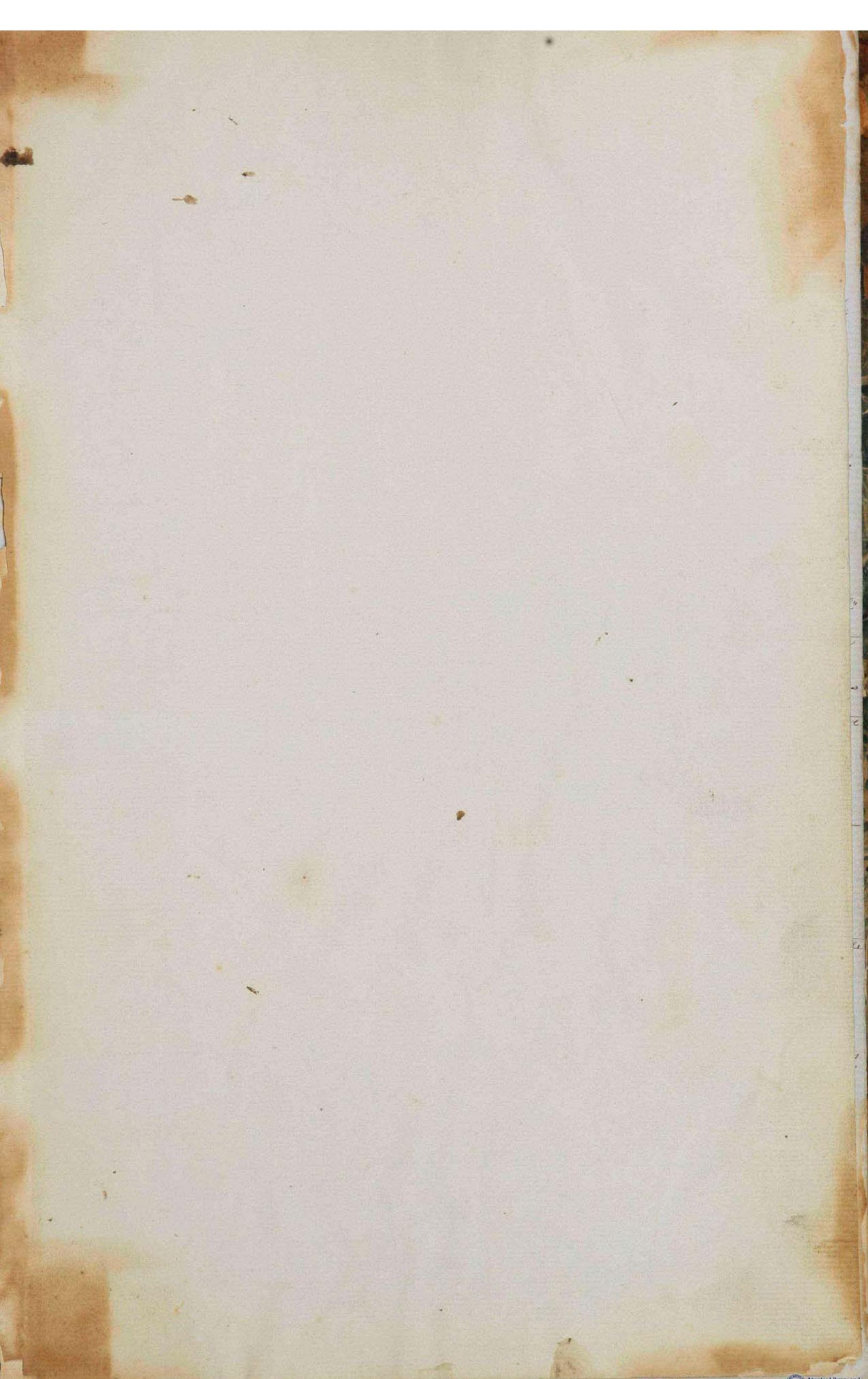
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# Mechanics' Institute of Montreal.

The general Committee met on Monday  
Evening, February 5<sup>th</sup> 1855.

Present — Messrs. Bulmer, Lyman, Kennedy Spence, Ladd,  
Bernard, Brown, Mitchell, Milln, Murray Spiers,  
Lambert and Stevenson.

The Minutes of last Meeting were read and confirmed.

Ref from Montreal Gazette L<sup>1</sup> 157 — Referred to Finance Com.

A Circular accompanying a volume of the "Canadian Journal,"  
was received from the Secretary of the Canadian Institute  
of Toronto, intimating that "in compliance with instructions  
received from the Joint Library Committee of the Legislative  
Assembly and the Legislative Council, the Mechanics'  
Institute of Montreal, is entitled to receive a copy of  
the "Canadian Journal" from the commencement of its  
publication until further notice."

Mr Lyman submitted a Report from Sub Committee  
on Finance — on motion of Mr Lyman, seconded  
by Mr Ladd, the Report was received.

It was moved by Mr Milln, seconded by Mr Spiers,  
That the Report do lay on the table for one month.  
Carried.

It was moved by Mr Lyman, seconded by Mr Ladd,  
That a Sub-Committee be appointed to revise the  
Bye-Laws of the Institute — to report as soon as  
practicable. — Carried The President named as  
said Committee — Messrs. Lyman Ladd, Murray Stevenson & Milln.

It was moved by Mr Murray, seconded by Dr Bernard,  
that the Boston Daily "Post" and the Portland "Eastern  
Argus be ordered for the Reading Room of the Institute  
Carried.

Mr Milln gave notice that in two weeks from hence

C. M. Warren Esq., of Cambridge, Mass. in consideration  
of the liberal deduction made in his aid for covering  
the roof of the new Hall. — Carried.

The president reported on behalf of Building

Committee, that Mr Macintosh was in treaty for the corner store in the new Building - that there was a probability of leasing it to him at a rental of (£175.0.0) One hundred and seventy-five pounds per annum, provided a temporary Building - one Story in height - was erected in rear, for the purpose of Storage. The estimated <sup>cost</sup> of said building would be from £30 to £75.0.0, and the Building Com. recommended the proposal as the best offer likely to be made.

It was moved by Mr Lyman, seconded by Mr Millin - That the Building Committee be authorized to incur the expense of Seventy-five Pounds, (£75.0.0) for the purpose of erecting a store of one story in the rear of the new Hall - provided a lease can be made of the corner Shop, with back Store @ £175.0.0 per annum. - Carried.

A letter was received from Mr Neil Mac Intosh  
offering to rent the two shops in the new hall, <sup>on a five years lease,</sup> at  
(£300.0.0) Three Hundred Pounds per annum.

It was moved by Mr Millin, seconded by Mr Lambert  
That the offer of Mr Mac Intosh be accepted, and  
that the President be authorized to sign a lease to  
that effect. Carried.

A verbal application <sup>from Mr J. B. Scott</sup> for rooms in the new

Hall, was refused for reasons specified in the following Resolution.

Moved by Mr-Brown, seconded by Mr-Spence:  
That it is inexpedient for the Institute to rent permanently, any of the apartments on the second floor of the New Hall. Carried.

It was moved by Mr-Spence, seconded by Mr-Murray - That Mr-Bertram be authorized to purchase a Musket at an expense of Twenty Shillings, to replace ~~the~~ one lost at the late Festival. Carried.

At an Extraordinary Meeting of the General Committee, called by order of the President and held on Wednesday the 7<sup>th</sup> March, at 10 o'clock, A. M. were present - Mess. Bulmer, Murray, Hopkins, Garth Mitchell, Fletcher Brown and Stevenson.

The Minutes of last meeting were read and approved.

The President stated that he had called this Extraordinary Meeting of Committee in consequence of the Resolution which had, by a majority of

one, been passed at the last Meeting; and with reference to which, notice of re-consideration had been given by Mr Murray, — also that the propriety of addressing His Excellency the Governor General, on his present visit to Montreal, might be taken up and decided on by the Meeting.

It was then moved by Mr Murray seconded by Mr Stevenson — That the Motion regarding an address to His Excellency the Governor General, moved at the previous meeting by Dr Bernard, seconded by Mr Gault, and carried by a majority of one, be now re-considered. — Carried.

The President explained that on Monday last, a note was received from Lord Bury, Private Secretary to His Excellency the Governor General, intimating that His Excellency would receive addresses, immediately after the Inauguration of the Exhibition on Tuesday, and he (the President) understood that the copies of all addresses intended to be presented, would require to be handed to the Secretary, of His Excellency, as soon as possible after their arrival in this City — consequently the Institute address had been sent, previous to the Meeting of Committee on Monday Evening last.

It was moved by Mr Brown, seconded by Mr Gault That in view of the explanation given by the President — the Resolution referred to above, be expunged from the Minutes, and that the original Motion, moved at last meeting, by Mr Murray and seconded by Mr Fletcher, do stand in its place. Carried.

May it please Your Excellency:

The Mechanics' Institute of Montreal, availing itself of the present opportunity, desires to congratulate Your Excellency on your safe arrival to fill the office of Governor General of these Provinces, and on your visit, on this interesting occasion, to the City of Montreal.

The Institute, as an Incorporated Association, desires to express its loyalty to Her Most Gracious Majesty the Queen, the pleasure with which it receives Your Excellency as Her Representative, and the earnest hope that your government in this country may add alike to your own renown, and to the happiness and prosperity of the Canadian People.

The Institute which we have the honor to represent, has already 800 members, it is in a state of most gratifying prosperity, and is just completing a large and elegant Mechanics' Hall, which we trust, on some future and not far distant occasion, may be honored by a visit from Your Excellency. We would most respectfully seek a continuance of the encouragement hitherto extended, and which, proceeding from so exalted a source, is so highly prized; and would, therefore, solicit Your Excellency's kind consideration, and the permission to address you as the Patron of the Mechanics' Institute of Montreal.

The Minutes of former meeting were read and approved.

The President reported that he had made enquiry  
respecting the premises now occupied by the Institute  
and had been informed by Mr Penn that they were  
anxious to obtain possession as soon as possible,  
but as Mr Hogan was out of town no definite  
arrangement had been made.

The President also reported that a General  
Meeting of the members had been held on the 27<sup>th</sup> ult.,  
which was very numerously attended — the Members  
approved of the Report submitted by the General  
Committee, and appointed Sub-Committees to carry  
it into effect.

The following Reports were made from the several Sub-Committees,—  
Mr Garth reported from the Sub-Committee on Lectures,  
that Dr R. P. Howard, had consented to deliver a  
Lecture on Chemistry, with experiments, and that  
a correspondence had been entered into, with Dr Marsh  
of Dulwich, with a view to obtain his services for  
the other scientific Lecture.

Mr Murray reported from the Essay & Opening Address  
Com — that several names had been before the Com.  
for the delivery of the Inaugural Address, but  
no decision had as yet been made. A form

of an Advertisement respecting the Prize Essay was submitted, when it was

Moved by Mr. Munay, seconded by Mr. Garth,  
That the form of Advertisement now submitted, be approved of, and that the Secretary be authorized to insert the same in the English papers of the City. 3 times a week for two weeks — Carried.

The Essay Committee were authorized to telegraph to some party in the United States, with a view to ascertain whether Elisha Burritt, Esq. were at present in the country and if he could be obtained to deliver the address at the opening of the new Hall.

Mr. Hopkins reported that the Fanny Fair Committee had resolved to address the Ladies of the City, by circular, soliciting contributions to that department.

A form of circular was submitted, when it was

Moved by Mr. Fletcher, seconded by Mr. Bertram,  
That the Secretary be authorized to print the requisite number of copies, and have them distributed as early as possible — Carried.

The Music Committee reported that two of the Institute Bands had agreed to render their services — (Munn's Sax Cornet and St. Patrick's) — the others would most likely do the same. Matters in general progressing favorably.

The Exhibition Com. reported progress.

The President stated that the Building Committee were desirous of obtaining the opinion of the General Com. respecting the Seats for the Lecture Room of the new Hall. Several samples had been sent in, none of which, however, could be recommended for approval.

After some conversation, on the subject, Mr Bernard was authorized to write to Boston, for a plan of the seats, in the Music Hall in that City.

It was moved by Mr Garth, seconded by Mr Bertram that a sub-committee be appointed to consider the propriety of erecting a permanent building in rear of the new Hall, of a uniform height with the main building — and that they report at next meeting. — Carried.

The President appointed as said Committee — Messrs Bulmer, Brown, Garth, Hopkins and Kennedy.

Present Messrs. — Bulmer, Bertram, Garth Munro, Bartley, Spiers, Lyman, Murray, Hopkins, Spence, Brown, Bernard, Fletcher and Stevenson.

The Minutes of last Meeting were read and approved.

An app was submitted from W. A. Townsend, £1.7/6 Referred to Fin. Com.

The President reported that he had seen Mr. Hogan respecting the premises now occupied by the Institute, and that that gentleman asked \$150.00 (One hundred and Fifty Dollars) for the use of the rooms for one month.

The Special Committee appointed at last Meeting to consider the propriety of erecting a permanent building in rear of the new Hall, reported verbally, that a building, such as it was contemplated to erect — four stories in height, with cut stone front on St. Peter Street, would cost about £1000. 0. 0 (One thousand Pounds.)

After some conversation on the subject, it was moved by Dr. Bernard, seconded by Mr. Gault — That, provided the money can be obtained on as favorable terms as the former loan, the Building Committee be authorized to prepare plans and specifications for the contemplated building — Carried.

A conversation took place regarding the necessity of engaging another superintendent for the more efficient management of the business of the Institute in the new Hall. It was agreed to let the matter lie over till next meeting.

Dr. Bernard reported that he had written to Boston for a plan of the seats in the Music Hall, to which no answer had yet been received.

It was moved by Mr. Bertram, seconded by Dr. Munroe That the Building Committee be authorized to make arrangements for the seats for the new Hall. — Carried.

Dr. Bernard reported that he had received a reply to the telegraphic message sent by him, stating that Mr. Elihu Burritt was, not, at the present time in the United States.

The Essay & Opening Address Committee reported that, in answer to their solicitation, <sup>the Hon.</sup> Mr. Justice Lybwin had consented to deliver the inaugural Address at the opening of the new Hall.

It was moved by Mr. Garth, seconded by Mr. Bartley, that a Special Committee, consisting of the Chairmen of the sub-committees of arrangements for the opening of the new Hall, be appointed to draw up a general Advertisement, to be inserted in all the papers once a week until the time of opening. — Carried

The Scientific Lecture Committee was authorized to make an arrangement with Rev. D. Marsh, of Quebec, for a Lecture during the Inauguration week — his expenses to be borne by the Institute.

An Application from Mr. Outram to deliver a Lecture on English Ballads, on the same occasion was referred to the Scientific Lecture Com.

The Consideration of the Report of Sub-Committee on Finance (laid over from March 26) was then taken up, and after some discussion, it was moved by Dr. Bernard, seconded by Mr. Garth —

That the Report be referred back to the Sub-Committee, with instructions from this Committee to draw up a Report in accordance with the Bye-Laws of the Institute. — Carried

The Minutes of last Meeting were read and approved

The President reported that the Building Committee had received no answer concerning the loan — but it was probable an answer would be given in a few days.

The President reported that an Advertisement had been prepared by the Chairman of Sub-Committee, and inserted in the papers twice a week until the first of May.

The Exhibition Committee reported — recommending that a special Advt be inserted in the papers — soliciting articles for Exhibition.

After some conversation, it was moved by Mr Murray, seconded by Mr Bertram — That the Report be referred to the Recording Secretary of the Institute with instructions to make such alterations in the general Advertisement as may meet the views of the Exhibition Committee — Carried

The President reported that the Contract for the seats for the new Hall, had not yet been given out—a pattern settee had been prepared, and was now submitted for the approval of the meeting. The estimated cost for each settee, was £3.10/.

The Committee having inspected the same, and suggested several alterations, it was moved by Mr. Murray, seconded by Mr. Garth, — That the Building Committee be authorized to give out a Contract for settees, similar to the one now presented, — with such alterations as have been recommended, so as to reduce the cost, if possible, to Twelve dollars £3.0.0 each. — Carried.

most unsatisfactory state, mainly attributable to ~~the~~ neglect in observing the 20<sup>th</sup> 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> Bye Laws, and as this Committee is of opinion, that a strict adherence to these Bye Laws will obviate, to a great extent present difficulties, Be it resolved, that from this date forward, these Bye Laws be strictly followed, and the Recording Secretary and Treasurer be at once notified to that effect, and desired to comply with this Resolution. Carried

It was moved by Mr. Spiers, seconded by Mr. Miller that the Finance Committee be instructed to prepare and lay before this Committee, within six weeks from date, an inventory of all property belonging to the Institute, together with a statement of the assets and liabilities of the Institute, and that the several officers and sub-Committees be requested to furnish to the Finance Committee such information as they may require, in order to make the statement complete. Carried.

The Report of the Finance Committee, submitted at last meeting, was then considered, and

That in future the Superintendant give his whole time to attendance to his duties at the Hall, excepting for one hour three times a day, which he shall be allowed for meals— That he procure a suitable boy to clean out the Building, carry Messages, &c. and that the collection of the fees, be entrusted to a regular Collector at a per Centage—the Superintendant furnishing him, from time to time with Receipts, and lists of the Members on whom to call.— They also recommend that Mr. Richardson be continued as Superintendant for the present— provided he agree to follow the Rules and Instructions to be given for his guidance, and that his Salary be increased to £100.0.0 (One Hundred Pounds) *per annum*, out of which he will procure a boy to assist him.

Inasmuch also as the duties of the Superintendant are not in any Bye Law, or otherwise prescribed, the Sub-Committee recommend that a Clause be added to the Rules of the Library & Reading Room, distinctly specifying what they are, and would suggest the following:—

"It shall be the duty of the Superintendant to open and close the Hall at the hours before-mentioned, — to see that the Rooms are properly and thoroughly cleaned, and swept, — to send to the Post Office several times daily, on the arrival of the principal Mails — to receive, arrange, and put on file, the Newspapers and Periodicals, and to see that they are all duly received, — to be in constant attendance at the Hall, on all lawful days, excepting from 8 to 9, from 1 to 2, and from 6 to 7 o'clock —

to see that all the Rules of the Reading Room and Library are observed — to keep the several books with which he ~~may~~ <sup>shall</sup> be entrusted, regularly written up — to attend to the renting of the various Rooms in the Building which may be required, and collect the Rents for the same, and generally to carry out the instructions of the Committee, and attend to the interests of the Institute

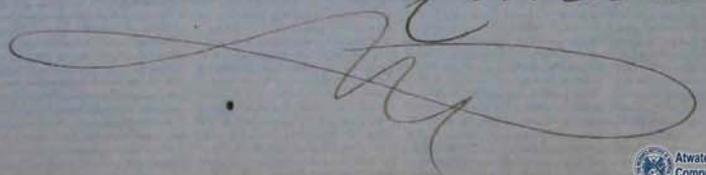

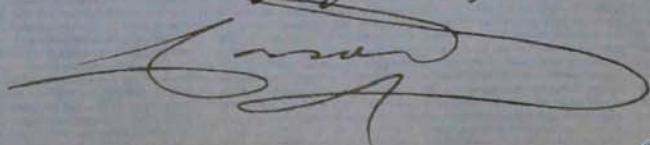

To the President & Members of the General Committee of the Mechanics Institute

The Industrial Committee of the Provincial Exhibition beg to report

That shortly after their appointment, an arrangement was entered into with the Agricultural Association of Lower Canada whereby that Association agreed to pay to your Committee the sum of £1375.0.0 for which they were to erect proper buildings affording as much space for exhibition purposes as was taken up for the Exhibition of 1857. To advertise a prize list equal in amount to that of last year and to assume the entire management of the Industrial Department of the Exhibition. Your Committee were also bound to deduct from the above sum such an amount as the Horticultural Building would cost in the event of the Committee deciding to use a Tent which course as you are doubtless aware they finally adopted.

Your Committee early in the season brought the Exhibition prominently before the Mechanics and Manufacturers by circulating Prize Lists which were principally done by the agent employed by your Committee (Mr. J. Telfer), who visited most of the Manufacturing Establishments in the City. Copies were also mailed to all the Manufacturers in both Upper & Lower Canada who would be at all likely to contribute anything to the Exhibition.

The Buildings were constructed by Mr. Francis Xavier Gougen for the sum of Three Hundred Pounds G

The Poultry Department which last year took up 50 feet of that Building was this year transferred to another Building in order to afford room for the articles entered in the Industrial Department. A few general remarks will convey all the information which your Committee consider necessary, in order to arrive at a just estimate of the superiority of the late Exhibition over any that has yet taken place in this portion of the Province. The number of Exhibitors this year was 360 last year 300 The number of Articles entered were far more numerous than last year. The display in some of the departments was such as to throw into the shade anything ever before attempted here. Amongst these was the Show of Fur, Furniture, Musical Instruments, ~~Stone Cutting~~, Architectural Drawing, Architectural Stone Cutting, Specimens of Typography, and the splendid assortment of elegant and costly goods exhibited in the Ladies department. Your Committee are aware that the Merits of the Exhibition were not set before the public in such a favourable light as they ought to have been they venture to say that had the Press of Montreal followed the example of their competitors in Toronto

The Exhibition here would not have been made to appear so insignificant an affair as any one would be led to suppose from the accounts given in our City papers from a comparison of the space taken up by the Industrial Department of the Toronto Exhibition and that of our own your Committee are led to believe that the Exhibition here must have been equal in extent to that of Toronto and the published lists of Prizes awarded demonstrates that over \$200<sup>00</sup> more was paid in premiums in Montreal than was awarded in Toronto As is usual in regard to Exhibitions there had been some dissatisfaction with the decisions of the judges but as the mal-contents have not been more numerous nor their complaints of a more serious character than on former occasions your Committee did not deem it necessary to reverse or set aside any decision given but have occupied themselves more profitably in winding up the affairs connected with the Exhibition. They are happy to have it in their power to inform you that all the Prizes awarded have been paid and the Diplomas forwarded to the Parties entitled to receive them And it affords them great satisfaction to report that after paying all expences there will remain the sum of between £500 and £550 which sum will be handed over to the Treasurer of the Institute at the latest by the middle of this week \$1850<sup>00</sup> being now in his possession In conclusion your Committee deem it fitting that they should acknowledge the invaluable services rendered by J. H. Beaver Esq. the respected President of this Institute whose unwearied and indefatigable exertions tended greatly to the success of the Exhibition

The Class Committee in closing their labours in connection with the Free  
Classes for the season beg to submit a short report of their pro-  
ceedings. They have carried out many of the suggestions contained in  
former reports relative to the establishment of such a system of rules  
for the guidance of both Teachers & pupils as would secure the  
satisfactory and beneficial working of the Classes & they are happy to say  
that greater diligence & a more punctual attendance has been the result.  
The Classes were opened on the 9<sup>th</sup> December 1858 & closed on the 18<sup>th</sup>  
of March 1859. During the first three months the attendance  
was most regular & satisfactory the application of the pupils  
all that could be desired and their improvement rapid. Afterward  
the attendance declined & during the last week became so irregular  
as to induce your Committee to close the classes at an earlier day than  
they intended. Your Committee are of opinion that if suitable prizes  
were offered for competition among the pupils the falling off in the attendance  
might in a great measure be prevented and would recommend that  
next season a judicious system of rewards for attendance, diligence  
and proficiency should be adopted

The reason generally assigned for irregular attendance was the unwillingness of employees to spare the time of their apprentices. This if correct exhibits great want of consideration on the part of employers and much ignorance of their own interests as well as those of their apprentices. And this matter should be brought under the notice of parents and guardians with a view that in becoming parties to the indenturing of apprentices they should secure for them a reasonable opportunity of profiting by the advantages which this Institute now affords. The means at the disposal of the Board of Arts and Manufactures did not enable it to grant a large sum in aid of the classes still your Committee consider that the sum so granted has enabled them to do much good and trust that they may be enabled to give even more liberal aid next season. The classes for Reading, Writing, & Mathematics were conducted by Mrs. T. Clancy to the entire satisfaction of your Committee.

His services were secured at the rate of £12.00 per month. Mechanical and Ornamental Drawing classes were taught gratuitously by Messrs. J. McFarlane & H. King. Also was Architectural Drawing by Mr. J. C. Hutchison & these gentlemen merit the best thanks of the Institute for their valuable services & disinterested kindness. The French classes Nos. 1 & 2 were under the care of Mr. T. C. Tanner who was paid also at the rate of £12.00 per month and whose attention and ability merit acknowledgement of your Committee. The average attendance during the season was 95. On the 16<sup>th</sup> February the classes were examined by Professor Dawson as representative of the Board of Arts and Manufactures and your Committee are happy to say that he expressed himself highly satisfied with the manner in which they were conducted and the proficiency made. The system of free classes in connection with your Institute is now an established fact, and your Committee would be glad to see it receive still further development by the establishment of Lecture classes on such of the Physical sciences as are most intimately connected with the Mechanical Arts. Practical chemistry illustrated by experiments, Natural Philosophy in several of its subdivisions and the illustration of the Mechanical Powers by proper working models would be subjects of high importance to the rising generation of mechanics and well worthy the attention of the Institute. In the opinion of your Committee it will be necessary to make arrangements in another year to secure another class room as the one now in use will not afford sufficient accommodation for a proper arrangement of the various classes and it is hoped an effort will be made to secure suitable furniture and apparatus. The Board of Arts & Manufactures having undertaken the management of a course of Lectures your Committee did not deem it necessary to take any action in that direction.

The Committee on Membership

Submit the following report

Immediately after the appointment of this Sub-Committee last November they commenced the duties assigned them with a thorough examination of all records of Membership lists of New Members admitted, and Cash Books containing the names of all members who paid subscriptions between 1854 & 1858 for the purpose of ascertaining the number of Members that renewed their subscriptions the number of New Members admitted and the number of subscriptions remaining due at the close of each year without regard to subscriptions due the previous year and also to learn what portion of the subscriptions that were not paid during the year they became due were ever paid after that time. And having carefully compared the records lists and Cash Books with the following statement to be sure of its general accuracy they now lay it before you as the result of their investigations

After making allowance for the very few who may have sent in their resignation according to the 9th Byelaw the average number of subscriptions due at the close of each year are equal to the number renewed during the year and the admission of 1043 New Members during four years have increased the list of paid subscriptions only 97 the list of 1854 showing 403 and that of 1858 five hundred members. Nearly one half of the renewed subscriptions are collected with great expence and trouble to the Institute the collector must call on all who have not resigned before the end of the previous year and for the first few days by calling on the best

paying Members he collects Ten or Twelve subscriptions daily  
but the number soon diminishes and by the time one hundred  
are collected three or four is a good days work which  
after a short time falls down to an average of four in  
a week and by the time that one half is paid the collector  
travels many days and collects nothing but promises he  
calls several times before he finds Members at home then the  
answer given may be that he only joined for last year or  
call again or call next week or perhaps he appoints a  
day and hour when the money will be ready but when  
the time and collector both come a more indefinite promise  
is given while many members promise to call and pay  
at the Institute but when asked for it there they have  
no money with them This in many cases goes on for two  
or three years while the Member is a constant visitor  
of the Reading Room & Library always ready to  
renew his promise but not his subscription and at last  
to the great relief of the collector he leaves the City and  
perhaps takes a Book with him which he has had out  
of the library for six months. Out of the 1043  
Members admitted during four years 146 or 1 in 15 never  
paid their subscription the average duration of Mem-  
bership or time the Member pay subscriptions is  
does not exceed Two and a half years

The Library & Reading Room form the chief attractions  
of the Institute and the manner in which they are kept  
supplied and managed will always have great in-  
fluence on the Membership list Many Members have left  
left from not being able to obtain the Books of their  
choice while those who had them out of the Library often  
retained them for several months. Loss of Members from  
this cause will now be prevented as long as the Library  
Committee enforce the rule for returning Books in a  
specified time Their resolution to issue Books only to Mem-  
bers whose subscriptions were paid while it has added  
materially to the list of paid subscriptions & to the funds of  
the Institute has also added to the numbers in the

Reading Room no many members who were accustomed to  
draw Books from the Library have since reading the  
notice on the door found new attractions in that  
Department and if the reading Room could be cleared of  
non-paying Members and others who are frequent visitors  
there would be much more room for those whose  
subscriptions are paid. After seeing the little progress  
made in adding to the list of paying Members owing to  
the difficulty or impossibility of collecting a large number  
of the subscriptions which are never paid your Committee  
would earnestly recommend that some other system of  
Membership be adopted if the Act of Incorporation can be  
so amended as to admit life Members at the lowest rate  
consistent with the Interests of the Institute and have the  
Amount paid in small installments extending over  
One and a half or Two years. The effect would be the  
Building up of a permanent Membership who would  
take more interest in the management of the Institute  
than can be expected from yearly subscribers at the  
same time all yearly subscriptions should be paid strictly  
in advance.
